CCB's serve children and adults with developmental delays and disabilities. They provide early intervention services, determine and manage eligibility for community-based services, provide family support funding, and some provide case management services.



Early Intervention Colorado / Child Find: 1-888-777-4041 <u>www.eicolorado.org</u> Child Find helps to identify infants and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities, and Early Intervention provides in home therapeutic services at no cost to families for ages birth-3 years old.

Their nurse-led teams provide care coordination for children and youth with special health care needs from birth to 21 years. Children can benefit from this program whether their needs are visible, such as a physical need, or invisible, such as a developmental, emotional, or behavioral need.
